

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTIONS 64 AND 65 SPECIAL DIRECTIONS

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of his powers under Section 65 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and having regard to Direction 59 of the Traffic Signs General Directions 2002 (Part II of SI 2002/3113, "the 2002 Directions"), hereby:-

- directs that, at appropriate sites on roads for which the City of Westminster is traffic authority, notwithstanding Direction 25 of the 2002 Directions, the road marking shown in diagram 1020.1 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002 (Part I of SI 2002 No. 3113) need not be used in conjunction with the sign to diagram 638 in Schedule 2 to those Regulations; and
- 2. directs that this Special Direction shall remain in force only until 1 May 2014.
