Authorisation of traffic signs and special directions

Secretary of State for Transport's traffic authorisation of signs/markings for the purpose of warning traffic of prohibited movements at appropriate junctions of a uni-directional road (including slip roads), and where Highways England is the traffic authority.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTIONS 64 AND 65 AUTHORISATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SPECIAL DIRECTIONS

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of his powers under Sections 64 and 65 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf for the purpose of warning traffic of prohibited movements at appropriate junctions of a uni-directional road (including slip roads), and where Highways England is the traffic authority, hereby:

- authorises the erection at appropriate sites on the said roads of a traffic sign (hereinafter referred to as "the authorised sign") consisting of a red reflective band conforming as to size, colour and character with that shown in the attached drawing numbered GT50/198/0069-1; and
- directs that the authorised sign shall only be erected subject to there being a pair or two pairs of the sign to diagram 616 in Schedule 3, Part 2, Item
 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 (Part 1 of S.I. 2016/362, "the 2016 Regulations") sited on the said roads; and
- directs that the authorised sign shall only be placed by Highways England operatives or by authorised persons acting on behalf of Highways England; and
- 4. directs that the authorised sign shall only be placed in accordance with the requirements shown on the said plan; and
- 5. directs that this authorisation shall remain in force until 31 October 2025, and after that date shall, without prejudice to giving of any further authorisation, cease to have effect. This authorisation may also cease to have effect on a date as may be appointed by one month's notice given by the Secretary of State in writing to the traffic authority for the removal or



alteration of the authorised sign and on that day the said authorisation shall, without prejudice to the giving of any further authorisation or direction, cease to have effect.

The provisions of Regulations 7, 8 and 11 of the 2016 Regulations shall apply to the authorised sign in the same manner as they apply to the sign shown in Schedule 2, Part 6, Item 2 to those Regulations.

- 4. directs that the authorised sign shall only be placed in accordance with the requirements shown on the said plan; and
- 5. directs that this authorisation shall remain in force until 31 October 2025, and after that date shall, without prejudice to giving of any further authorisation, cease to have effect. This authorisation may also cease to have effect on a date as may be appointed by one month's notice given by the Secretary of State in writing to the traffic authority for the removal or



alteration of the authorised sign and on that day the said authorisation shall, without prejudice to the giving of any further authorisation or direction, cease to have effect.
