Authorisation of traffic signs and special directions

Accessible transcript

Secretary of State for Transport's traffic authorisation of traffic signs for the purposes of providing information to road users at appropriate locations on roads for which National Highways is the traffic authority.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTIONS 64 AND 65 AUTHORISATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SPECIAL DIRECTIONS

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of her powers under Sections 64 and 65 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all powers enabling her in that behalf, for the purposes of providing information to road users, hereby:-

- authorises at appropriate locations on roads for which National Highways is the traffic authority, the display of the legend "COLLISION" or "COLLISIONS" (hereinafter referred to as "the authorised legend") on variable message signs (VMS) as defined in Schedule 1 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2016 (Part 1 of S.I. 2016/362, "the 2016 Regulations"); and
- directs that all provisions available for display of "ACCIDENT" on VMS in Schedule 16 of the 2016 Regulations shall apply to the display of the authorised legend; and
- directs that the authorised legend may be used in the place of "ACCIDENT" for all previous authorisations made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 and
- 4. directs that the authorised legend be supplemented by further information (hereinafter referred to as "associated text") such as is required to indicate the nature, severity, location, direction, extent, impact or status of any collision or route referred to or any appropriate combination of these details; and
- 5. directs that the authorised legend and any associated text may be displayed in white, off white, yellow or amber on a dark background; and
- 6. directs that the authorised legend and any associated text may be displayed in upper case or sentence case; and



- 7. directs that a VMS must display the whole of the authorised legend and any associated text at the same time and only at such times as are appropriate to indicate that the conditions described apply and that, when not displaying any message, the sign face of the VMS shall remain blank; and
- 8. directs without prejudice to any statutory provision to the like effect, that it is a condition of this authorisation that the use of the authorised legend shall continue to have effect only until such day as may be appointed by one month's notice given by the Secretary of State in writing to the traffic authority for the removal or alteration of the authorised legend and on that day the said authorisation shall, without prejudice to the giving of any further authorisation or direction, cease to have effect.

The provisions of Schedule 16 to the 2016 Regulations shall apply to the authorised legend as they apply to the legends prescribed in Schedule 16 to those Regulations.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 – SECTIONS 64 AND 65 AUTHORISATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNS AND SPECIAL DIRECTIONS

The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of her powers under Sections 64 and 65 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all powers enabling her in that behalf, for the purposes of providing information to road users, hereby:-

- directs that all provisions available for display of "ACCIDENT" on VMS in Schedule 16 of the 2016 Regulations shall apply to the display of the authorised legend; and
- directs that the authorised legend may be used in the place of "ACCIDENT" for all previous authorisations made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984;
 and
- 4. directs that the authorised legend be supplemented by further information (hereinafter referred to as "associated text") such as is required to indicate the nature, severity, location, direction, extent, impact or status of any collision or route referred to or any appropriate combination of these details; and
- 5. directs that the authorised legend and any associated text may be displayed in white, off white, yellow or amber on a dark background; and
- 6. directs that the authorised legend and any associated text may be displayed in upper case or sentence case; and



- 7. directs that a VMS must display the whole of the authorised legend and any associated text at the same time and only at such times as are appropriate to indicate that the conditions described apply and that, when not displaying any message, the sign face of the VMS shall remain blank; and
- 8. directs without prejudice to any statutory provision to the like effect, that it is a condition of this authorisation that the use of the authorised legend shall continue to have effect only until such day as may be appointed by one month's notice given by the Secretary of State in writing to the traffic authority for the removal or alteration of the authorised legend and on that day the said authorisation shall, without prejudice to the giving of any further authorisation or direction, cease to have effect.

The provisions of Schedule 16 to the 2016 Regulations shall apply to the authorised legend as they apply to the legends prescribed in Schedule 16 to those Regulations.
